ORM-D Expires December 31, 2020 -

According to 49-CFR 172.316 and the Exception Packing instructions for Column 8A of the Hazardous Materials Table, the ORM-D designation will expire on December 31, 2020. You will have to make sure your packages are packaged, marked, and shipped per Limited Quantity requirements starting January 1, 2021. ID8000, Consumer Commodity may continue to be used according to 173.167.
